

# REDEEMED TO SOMETHING

## Titus 2:14

### Theme: Three prepositions of redemption

WBC, Sunday a.m., July 15, 2018, Pastor Dan Unruh

WBC Statement of Faith: “**Redemption** – As a result of the fall, every man is a slave to sin. With His precious blood Christ paid the ransom, buying the believer back out of the bondage of sin (Mt 20:28; Heb 9:12). As a ‘redeemed’ sinner, the believer is doubly owned by God—once as Creator and then as Redeemer—and is doubly responsible to glorify Him (1 Cor 6:19-20).”

*If your sins are forgiven and you are on your way to heaven then you must have been*

#### I. **REDEEMED BY SOMETHING** – the Price of redemption

*Who gave himself for us*

#### II. **REDEEMED FROM SOMETHING** – the Power of redemption

*That he might redeem us from all iniquity*

*To better understand this point it helps to better understand these 3 words:*

##### A. “Sold”

1. Describes the redeemed who are still **Fleshly** (Rom 7:14)

2. Describes the **unredeemed** who are still **Filthy**

B. “Redeem” = “to buy back” (Ruth); “to set free” (Titus 2:14)

C. “Iniquity” = “lawlessness”

It is incongruous for one who is redeemed \_\_\_\_\_ lawlessness to then practice or excuse the very thing from which he was redeemed!

#### III. **REDEEMED \_\_\_\_\_ SOMETHING** – the P\_\_\_\_\_ of redemption

*And purify unto himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works*

##### A. In the N\_\_\_\_\_ Life – Transformation

Romans 8:23, “...we ourselves groan within ourselves, waiting for the adoption, to wit, the redemption of our \_\_\_\_\_.”

1 John 3:2, “...when he shall appear, we shall be \_\_\_\_\_ him; for we shall see him as he is.”

##### B. In the N\_\_\_\_\_ Life

1 John 3:3, “And every man that hath this hope in him \_\_\_\_\_ himself, even as he is pure.”

God’s grace does not give \_\_\_\_\_; it gives lessons!

2. P\_\_\_\_\_

This compound word in Greek means, “to be \_\_\_\_\_”

Two things are said to “appear” in Titus 2:11-15:

a. **God’s G\_\_\_\_\_ (11-12)**

b. **God’s G\_\_\_\_\_ (13-15)**

*Granville-Sharp* rule: “**two singular nouns** referring to a person, when joined by [“**and**”] and introduced by a single **article**, refer to \_\_\_\_\_ and the \_\_\_\_\_ person.” – *The great God and our Savior Jesus Christ*
